A simple model that works

The impact 100 model is simple.

A minimum of 100 donations of \$1000 per member per annum are combined to raise a minimum of \$100 000 annually. This is granted to an organisation through an application process that can have a real and measurable impact. Impact 100 Tasmania is one of 60 communities around the globe, and one of 5 in Australia to establish this amazing concept and see the enormous benefits of collective giving.

100% of funds raised go to the recipient charity there are no administration costs or overheads deducted from your donation. All funds are held in a sub fund trust with the Australian Communities Fund (www.communityfoundation.org.au).

Gifts with impact

Each year members choose which project to fund from a shortlisted well researched projects with outstanding prospects for making a significant impact in the Tasmanian community.

In 2017 we hope to make an extraordinary impact by funding projects that benefit the disadvantaged in at least one of the following areas:

Family & Community ● Arts & Culture ● Education ● Environment ● Health & Wellness

We want this to be a significant grant that will have an extraordinary impact for the recipient charity, taking the organisation to another level with significant funding, meeting a compelling and urgent need and advancing their vision in a great leap.
